Colossians 3:22-25 servants of the Lord

1. Growing up in Him • (Review)

- a. Marriage is a mystery concerning Christ and the church (the body of Christ) (Eph 5:32)
- b. Parents need to raise their children in the Lord. (Eph 6:4, Gal 4:1-2)
- c. Children should honor their parents (even as adults) (1 Tim 5:4)
- d. Family is the first ministry. (Husbands, wives, children) (1 Tim 5:8)

2. Servants, obey... • Colossians 3:22-24

- a. Not necessarily "slave". (ie employee)
- b. "Servant differs from slave, as the servant's subjection to a master is voluntary, the slave's is not..." Websters 1828 Dictionary
- c. If you can be free of earthly masters, be free. Regardless, you serve the Lord. Serve your earthly masters well. (1 Cor 7:21-24, 1 Tim 6:1-2).
- d. "...singleness of heart, fearing God." Unbelievers especially will look upon what you do. (Eph 5:3)
- e. Why serve earthly masters well? To show what the grace of God teaches us. (Titus 2:9-12)
- f. "Ye serve the Lord Christ." We are free and at liberty in Christ, yet we should serve Him. (Gal 5:1, 2 Cor 5:17)
- g. The servant of the Lord must be... so that... (2 Tim 2:24-26)
- h. Your reward is of the Lord. Your service is judged. (Col 2:18, 2 Cor 5:10-11, 1 Cor 3:13-16)

3. He that doeth wrong • Colossians 3:25

- a. What kind of service are you doing?
- b. Denying the Lord service results in loss. (works that will be burned away) (2 Tim 2:11-13)
- c. Serving your flesh reaps corruption, serving the Spirit reaps life. (Gal 6:7)
- d. This does not mean you lose salvation. "He himself shall be saved." This judgement is of your service. Your sin was already forgiven.
- e. Good service = good reward. (Eph 6:5-8)

4. Masters, give... • Colossians 4:1

- a. Master (ie employer)
- b. "A man who rules, governs or directs either men or business." Websters 1828 Dictionary
- c. Just and equal. The labourer is worthy of his reward. (1 Tim 5:18)
- d. The believing master ought to treat his servants well. He or she, as all others, is accountable to the Lord.

5. Relationships under grace (Recap)

a. Each relationship described (husbands, wives, children, parents, servants, masters, the church) operates directly based on a personal relationship with the Lord under grace.

- i. Wives \rightarrow willing submission to husbands as Christ submitted to the Father, even as His equal
- ii. Husbands \rightarrow love wives as Christ gave up His life for the church while we were yet enemies
- iii. Children \rightarrow need to grow in understanding of the Lord, as there are those in the church that need to grow in understanding of the Lord
- iv. Parents \rightarrow instruct children so that they may grow, without discouraging them, as those with understanding in the body ought to help others to grow
- v. Servants \rightarrow Ultimately serve the Lord, as every member of the body serves our Head and Master
- vi. Masters \rightarrow Ultimately serve the Lord, treat servants as your master treats you.
- b. Day to day living requires you to understand Christ and His relationship to the church. (Acknowledgement of the mystery Col 2:2)
