Colossians Introduction

1. Context

- a. Colossae was in Phrygia, in Asia minor. Paul had been through here before, but has not met the audience he writes to in the epistles to the Colossians. (Acts 18:23, Col 1:4, 8)
- b. Paul is in bonds, there are no mentions of sign gifts. (Col 4:3)
- c. Clearly speaks of the revelation of the mystery of Christ. "mystery" $4x \rightarrow$ (Col 1:26, 1:27, 2:2, 4:3)
- d. The Colossians:
 - i. Saved members of the body at Colosse, heard gospel through Epaphras. Paul has not met them. (Col 1:5-7)
 - ii. Were affected by philosophy and vain deceit. (Col 2:3, 2:8)
 - iii. Letter also shared with Laodicea (Col 4:16)

2. Purpose of the Book

- a. To be filled with the knowledge of His will... (Col 1:9)
- b. That ye may walk worthy... (Col 1:10)
- c. In Christ are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. (Col 2:3, Eph 3:8)
- d. That ye may stand perfect and complete in all the will of God. (Col 4:12, 2 Tim 3:16-17)

3. Passages we Often Reference

- a. **1:9-10** (filled with knowledge, worthy walk), **1:14** (redemption through His blood), **1:16** (Jesus Christ created all things), **1:25-26** (dispensation of God, mystery)
- b. **2:6** (so walk ye in Him), **2:10** (ye are complete in Him), **2:14-15** (making a show of principalities and powers)
- c. 3:2 (affection on things above), 3:10 (ye have put on the new man), 3:23 (whatsoever ye do)
