Israel Shall Be Saved

"So all Israel shall be saved: as it is written..." - Rom 11:26

1. Preface

- a. When the Bible speaks of Israel, it means Israel.
- b. The body of Christ is not Israel. Neither Jew nor Greek in the body of Christ. (Gal 3:28)
- c. The covenants belong only to Israel. Their promises will one day be fulfilled. (Rom 9:4-5)
- d. We do not know Christ after the flesh today. (2 Cor 5:16)

2. "Salvation is of the Jews" • John 4:22

- a. The Kingdom of Israel shall be established forever. (2 Sam 7:12-13, Dan 2:44)
- b. The Redeemer shall come to Zion and reign (Is 59:20, Is 61:2)
- c. A New Covenant will be made with Israel. (Jer 31:31-34)
 - i. The law will be written in their hearts. (Ez 36:25-28)
 - ii. The law will be taught from Zion. (Mic 4:1-2)
 - iii. The spirit of grace will be upon Israel. (Zech 12:10)
- d. The nations (Gentiles) shall come to the light of Jerusalem (Is 60:1-3)
 - i. All of Israel shall know the Lord. (Jer 31:34)
 - ii. Israel shall be a baptized nation of Priests. (Is 61:6, Ez 36:25)
 - iii. All heathen shall know the Lord. (Ez 36:23)

3. "The kingdom is nigh" • Luke 10:9

- a. Jesus came preaching the coming kingdom and taught His disciples to teach likewise (Lk 9:1-2, 6, Lk 10:9-10, 19, Lk 17:20-21)
 - i. To Israel only. (Mt 10:5-8, 15:24)
 - ii. Offered to Israel, signs and wonders proved it could come. (Acts 3:19-21, 4: Is 35:3-6)
- b. Christ came (Mt 16:16, 20)
 - i. The first time to suffer (Lk 4:19, Acts 3:18)
 - ii. And will come again in vengeance against enemies (Is 61:2) unto salvation for believers. (Heb 9:28, 10:26)
 - iii. Before Israel's salvation comes wrath, judgement. (Mt 24:21, 35-41, Lk 19:11-14, 21)
- c. The New Covenant was dedicated at Christ's death. (Heb 9:16)
 - i. The first was made old. (Heb 8:13)
 - ii. The remnant of Israel tasted of it, but it has not yet been fulfilled. (Acts 2:2, 16 Heb 6:4)
- d. Jesus taught believing Israel that they were the light of the world (Mt 5:13-15)
 - i. The remnant was told they were a nation of priests. (1 Pt 2:9)

4. The kingdom rejected • Romans 11:25

- a. The nation of Israel rejected their Messiah, and the comforter. (Acts 5:30-32, Acts 7:51-60)
- b. Israel will one day return and be saved according to their new covenant (Romans 11:25-27)
