

Galatians 1:6-9 Those That Trouble You

1. Grace wherein we stand • Galatians 1:6

- a. *The gospel* we preach was first dispensed to Paul by the Lord Jesus Christ Himself. (1 Tim 2:7, 1 Cor 9:7, Gal 1:11)
- b. All who are saved are called by *the gospel*. (2 Thess 2:14)
- c. Access by faith (belief in *the gospel*) into this grace (getting what we don't deserve) wherein we stand (we have a vocation/position). (Rom 5:2, 1 Cor 15:1-4,)
 - i. Only by grace are we what we are in Christ. To walk in this is **not vain**. (1 Cor 15:10)
 - ii. **God** has made us meet to be partakers of inheritance. (Col 1:12-13, Eph 2:1)
 - iii. There is to be **NO** boasting, no glorying of men, our flesh, our efforts. (Eph 2:8-9, Rom 3:26-27)
 - iv. *The gospel* is the power of God unto salvation. (Rom 1:16)
- d. Thank God for His unspeakable gift! Glory to God alone. (2 Cor 9:15, Gal 1:5)

2. Removed from Him that called • Galatians 1:6

- a. Not just departing - the *speed* in departing. The Galatians are quite troubled. (Gal 5:7)
- b. They had once readily received the gospel from Paul. They were overjoyed! (Gal 4:13, 15)
- c. The Galatians have rejected their standing. They are hindered from carrying out God's will. (Gal 5:7)
- d. Another gospel? Paul had received a gospel directly from the Lord. (Gal 1:12, 2:7)
 - i. Jesus in His earthly ministry taught His audience they were under the law. (Mt 5:18-19, 22:38-40, 23:1-3)
 - ii. Jesus reveals from ascended glory that we are now not under the law. (Rom 6:14, Rom 7:4, Gal 3:25)
 - iii. The gospel preached today crucifies us with Christ when we believe. (Gal 2:20, Gal 3:27, 1 Cor 12:13)

3. A perverted gospel • Galatians 1:7-9

- a. What trouble? A perverted gospel that opposes service to the Lord (Titus 1:10-11, Gal 2:4)
 - i. Imposing Israel's ordinances on the church today is in error. (1 Tim 4:1, Gal 6:15, Col 2:14-16)
 - ii. To be put under the law today = unable to serve the Lord in Liberty. (Gal 5:1, Gal 3:10)
 - iii. Religion is a show in the flesh. (Eph 4:17, Col 2:20-23, Gal 6:12)
 - iv. An error in the gospel sends the unsaved to hell and places the saved into bondage. It overthrows and shipwrecks faith. (2 Tim 2:18, 1 Tim 1:19-20)
- b. Those that teach another gospel? "Let him be accursed." Paul says it again.
 - i. Deliver to Satan, stop their mouths, do not allow blaspheming. (1 Cor 5:5, 1 Tim 1:19-20)
 - ii. Those that trouble ought to be cut off, lest they corrupt. (Gal 5:12, 1 Cor 5:6)
 - iii. Withstand the false doctrine. Be set for the defense of the gospel. Reprove, rebuke, exhort... with doctrine. (Phil 1:17, 2 Tim 4:2-4)
